BPAF supported the installation of solar power to the academy. As a result, it was able to open its doors again in September, for the 2022 -2023 school year!

My gaze fixed on a fence, a vivid reminder of the island's past. It stood as a sentinel, almost completely submerged in the rising waters, a silent witness to the relentless forces of nature.

Today, in 2023, my experience in Belize serves as a stark reminder of the urgency of our mission. Our precious natural habitats are disappearing before our eyes, and time is slipping away. But it's not too late. Together, we can rewrite this narrative.


